**Urban Fantasy, *Caged*, Released by Fairfax Writer**  
Book One in *V to Z*, an Urban Fantasy Trilogy, by JP Robinson

**For Immediate Release -- Fairfax, VA --** *Caged*, a gripping, fast-paced urban fantasy novel, is being released by local author JP Robinson on October 22, 2016. The plot? A scientist and the federal agent who is hoping to keep her alive are trapped in a secure government building with a horde of hungry vampires. It wouldn't be that unusual of a night, if it weren't for the zombies. Set in an alternate modern-day Northern Virginia, *Caged* is the first book in the *V to Z Trilogy*; by the third book, the D.C. Cate works as a scientist for the National Vampire Intelligence Agency (NVIA), researching a vaccine for vampirism. Daniel, the leader of a vampire resistance group, takes the building and all those inside hostage to expose the agency's cruel experiments on his fellow vees. Mason, a special agent investigating the hostage situation from inside the building, also happens to be Cate's former fiance. Unbeknownst to all of them, another threat is lurking in the building -- a vampire mutation who resembles the living dead, with no preference between vampire or human when it comes to feeding time.

Adult readers of action thrillers and speculative fiction alike will be compelled by the juxtaposition of a hostage situation in a federal building, a vampire infestation, and the genesis of zombies.

*Caged* is the debut novel of Fairfax resident JP Robinson. JP is a writer, performer, and video producer, who received a BFA in Film and TV Production from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. JP's writing includes a myriad of formats, from radio commentary to hour-long storytelling shows, and screenplays to novels. Other publications include the true, personal story, "The Game," in *Sucker for Love*, and, "What Are the Odds?" in *The Northern Virginia Review*, Volume 29. JP is a storyteller with and the founder of Better Said Than Done, Virginia's premiere storytelling troupe, has told stories at venues throughout Virginia, DC, and Maryland, and has been a regular commentator on WAMU, DC's NPR station.
